A Look Back at Northern Mexico

Vince will bring in live specimens and the programs will include the following plants Ariocarpus, Astrophytum, Aztekium, Ferocactus Geohintionia, Leuctenbergia, Lophophora, Obregonia, Thelocactus, Agave, Bombax, Bursera, Calibanus, Dioon, Echeveria, Senecio, Yucca, and a few other.

Vince started growing cactus at around age seven because his great grandmother worked for a cactus nursery and she would give him plants. He would usually kill them! He started getting serious in the hobby around 18 years ago when he visited the Huntington Botanical Gardens and later went to the Intercity Show. There he found information about the San Gabriel Club and has been a member ever since. He is a past President, Vice President, Winter Show Chair and newsletter editor of the San Gabriel Club. He will finish up his term as President for the Orange County Cactus Club this year and continue as show entry chair next year.
